The Antarctic Peninsula is rapidly changing with climate changes becoming more pronounced and human activity, both science and tourism, growing each year. Antarctic Treaty Parties have identified this growth and are increasing pressure for further regulations to be put in place. The SCP will assist by developing a spatial zoning plan that can be used by IAATO and the Antarctic Treaty to identify sites important to the three primary stakeholders – biodiversity, tourism, and science.

An important aspect of the SCP process is identifying stakeholder values in the region and then setting targets for each of these values. Jasmine first led workshop participants in identifying

Once data collection is complete, Jasmine can incorporate the targets and spatial data into the prioritisation software to produce the final zoning plans. The prioritisation will be run multiple times using various scenarios (e.g. differing levels of growth) and incorporating different aspects (e.g. locking current protected areas into the biodiversity zone). 





